JeffSTAT Pre-Hospital Registered Nurse Training Program

Prepare for a career in an Emergency Medical Services or critical care transport system

The JeffSTAT Pre-Hospital Registered Nurse (PHRN) Training Program is a 14-week intensive program that prepares the experienced Registered Nurse accustomed to practicing in a controlled hospital environment to practice in an autonomous, uncontrolled, out-of-hospital setting. PHRNs provide nursing care under the guidance of a pre-determined set of treatment protocols approved by a system medical director and usually practice in an Emergency Medical Services (EMS) or critical care transport system. Our program will prepare students to take both the National Registry EMT practical examination and the Paramedic Assessment (computer-based written examination). Students will also gain the knowledge and skills necessary to successfully care for patients in the pre-hospital and inter-facility settings.
